References can be mentioned as and when they referred in the Thesis and details should be provided in the reference chapter as per the format **(Enclosure-1)**.

The structure of the Thesis is Introduction, literature review, chapter 3, 4, 5, 6 (optional) chapter 7 is summary & conclusions and recommendations followed by references. Chapter 3, 4, 5, and chapter 6 (if exists) shall contain core work of the thesis as per the abstract. Theoretical Analysis, Experimental work, Results & Discussions related to research work are expected to be covered in these chapters.

Further, Certificate issued by the supervisor & Co-Supervisor should be as per the format **(Enclosure-2)**. Except above, the remaining guide lines for writing thesis will continue. Hard bound thesis copy should be submitted during the viva-voce examination for library purpose.

These orders come with immediate effect i.e. from 30.06.2015 onwards.

Text: Indicate references by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text. The actual authors can be referred to, but the reference number(s) must always be given.

Example: '..... as demonstrated [3,6]. Barnaby and Jones [8] obtained a different result '

List: Number the references (numbers in square brackets) in the list in the order in which they appear in the text.

Examples:

Reference to a journal publication: [1] J. van der Geer, J.A.J. Hanraads, R.A. Lupton, The art of writing a scientific article, *J. Sci. Commun.* 163 (2010) 51–59.

Reference to a book: [2] W. Strunk Jr., E.B. White, *The Elements of Style*, fourth ed., Longman, New York, 2000.

Reference to a chapter in an edited book: [3] G.R. Mettam, L.B. Adams, How to prepare an electronic version of your article, in: B.S. Jones, R.Z. Smith (Eds.), *Introduction to the Electronic Age*, E-Publishing Inc., New York, 2009, pp. 281–304.

Note: titles of all referenced articles should be included. Avoid the use of non-retrievable reports. We strongly recommend references to archival literature (and not personal communications or Web sites) only.

Note: However for English Language & Literature, latest version of MLA Handbook has to be followed for Citations
